elcome to the first edition of the Ironwood Art Guide.

This guide showcases Ironwood's vibrant art community. We're proud to share our impressive art filled town alive with art inside and out all year long. Nearly ten years ago our catalyst was Downtown Art Place, now it's grown to inspire many other artists and businesses that feature art on their walls. This great art vibe has attracted more creative people to get involved in community events that offer art, food, family fun, and music.

Ironwood has a great walkable downtown to *Find Your Art*. Enjoy quaint little resting places like the flowering Pocket Park, activities in Depot Park where Ironwood Chamber of Commerce resides and Festival Ironwood thrives in July. Take a walk along the paved Iron Belle Trail to the Montreal River or bike the trail all the way through to Bessemer and Ramsay. Downtown Art Park has a selfie station across the street from the Ironwood Theatre marquee that enhances the art murals waiting to be discovered.

The Emberlight Festival propelled us to the next level in the arts with eight weeks of live performances, International Film Festival, Art in the Park and art exhibits. The City Square encompassing a half city block offers families a splash pad and First Friday events with a large art vendor market, a free family art project and live music on stage during the summer months. During winter months, there are many fun things to do in downtown Ironwood. City Square offers a warm gathering place around a gas fire pit, "Finnish" Line for SISU Ski Fest, a winter ice skating rink and holiday-lighted Jack Frost Parade the first Saturday in December.

AN ARTFUL GLIMPSE OF HISTORIC IRONWOOD

Public art is a cultural asset available to all. It's a way to enrich a diverse community and celebrate Ironwood's vibrant history, culture, and environment through art in public spaces.

HISTORIC IRONWOOD THEATRE

Built in 1928, in the Italianate architectural style, the theatre possesses all of the features you would expect of an early 20th century theatre: ornate wall and ceiling hand-painted murals and plenty of gilded ornaments. IRONWOOD MEMORIAL BUILDING

Over 34 historic photographs are displayed in the hallways of the Ironwood Memorial Building along with 47 historic stained glass windows and a bronze statue of a WWI doughboy. 




